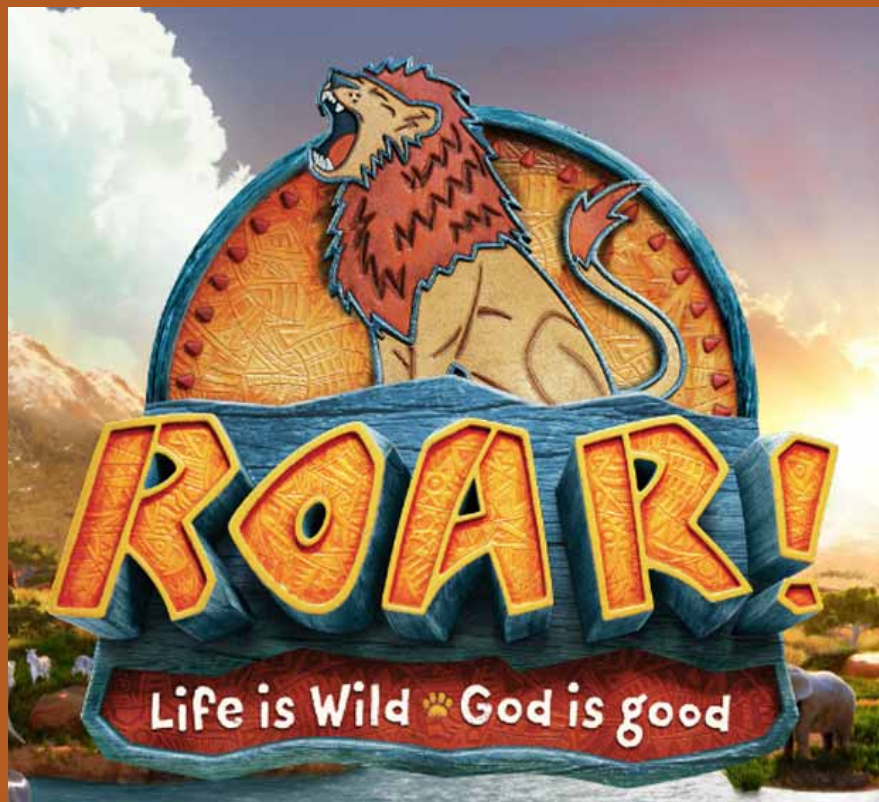

TRADITIONS...

The tradition of the red doors dates back centuries. There are several meanings associated with red doors. Red symbolizes the sacrificial Blood of Christ that saves those who come to him. Red is also a reminder of the Passover and a sign of the Holy Spirit. Church doors began to be painted red as a way of remembering the ultimate sacrifice that others made for their faith.

The red doors of churches traditionally indicated a place of sanctuary, refuge and safety. Those in need would not be captured or harmed inside the holy walls of the church, which offered physical and spiritual protection.

Some believe that the doors of the Wittenberg Cathedral, where Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses were red. Red doors on Protestant Churches indicate their roots in the Reformation.

Notes from the Missions / Serve Committee:

In this column, we often discuss serving various groups or communities in a Christian manner - Food Pantry, Food for Thought, Caring Hands, Silver Link, etc. Let's talk this month about serving particular people that you may "run into" in your life in everyday circumstances. I heard this story recently while I was back home in South Dakota for my mother's funeral and this story came from a family member.

So, let's set the scene - the family member was driving in Sioux Falls on his way to work and a car with a 20yr old driver came out from a side street and although they tried to avoid each other, they collided and there was about \$2,000 damage to my family member's pickup. The 20yr old was on her way to work at a local daycare and said she didn't have insurance and was very sorry for the accident. My family member, who incidentally has a 20yr old daughter, didn't want this young person to have a record and create an insurance problem for everyone. So a plan / agreement was worked out, typed up and signed by both parties for her to pay something every month and work off this debt without getting in trouble with the law.

You may be thinking "good luck" at getting any money out of a 20yr old with a minimum-wage job. I would too. But guess what? She now has insurance, has been paying off her bill faithfully and showing that she can be trusted - she has just \$200 left to pay. When she's finished paying off her bill, my family member told her that he would write a letter of recommendation for any job she's applying for.

That family member is my younger brother Mark who took the path of serving this young woman in a Christian manner. He was more worried about her future than he was about the dent in his pickup. The dent could be fixed - her futures could have been "dented" for some time. Serving can take many forms and being compassionate to the people you "run into" every week is an opportunity to reflect your Christian values and plant a seed of compassion within others.

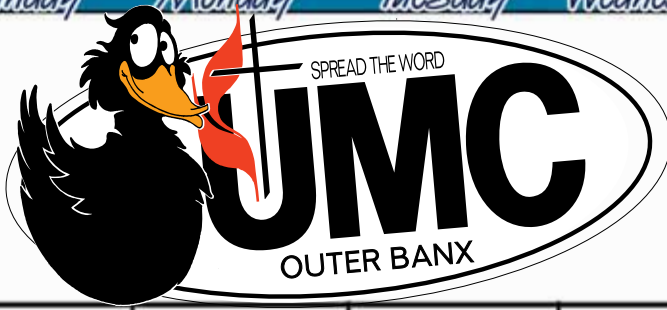
