Grab your Fedora

"We're on a Mission from Gahhhdd" says Elwood Blues in the movie the "The Blues Brothers". Can we say the same? Can I? Is that you Jake under

that fedora? Elwood?

Jake Blues rejoins with his brother Elwood after being released from prison, but the duo has just days to reunite their old R&B band and save the Catholic home where the two were raised.

At one point, they visit a church to find a bandmate and Jake is illuminated by a light coming through the stained glass window over the back of the altar. Hmmm... was that the Holy Spirit?

Jake is transformed by the experience - and has a response to an altar call like no other doing whole body flips all the way down the center aisle.

They have a goal and it's a good one for a change - and one of the best catch-phrases of all time is born "We're on a mission from God". Only draw out how you say God - like Gahhhhd. Use your Brooklyn accent.

So, as we look around at Duck Church let's ask ourselves: "are we on a mission from God?"

In the book, <u>"The Man in the Mirror"</u> by Patrick Morley, there is a section on disciple-making. Let's start with the great commission:

Matthew 28:19-20. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Ok, that's all well and good. Now what? Proclaiming is one thing, exercising your disciple muscles is another.

According to Morley, being a disciple includes 3 parts: 1.) A disciple is called to live in Christ. 2.) A disciple is equipped to live like Christ which includes spiritual growth and transformation, and helping others to learn about and become like him. And 3.) a disciple is sent to live like Christ - serving others, bearing much fruit, loving others, and caring for the poor and needy.

So, where does it start? It's starts, like all things we know, with education. I didn't learn advanced math by starting with calculus. We start small and work up buttercup.

It's starts with children's church. And progresses on to D6 and youth group on Sunday nights. Our very own Director of family ministry, Brooke Nasser started the Duck Church day camp last summer, introducing some kids to church and - get this - praying for the first time.

For adults, regular church attendance is a must. Pastor Chris brings his A-game every week with tangible, practical advice and insight on really



living the Christian life. Take notes on the half-sheet in the bulletin. Keep it in your pocket all week and refer to it daily. I keep them and refer to them - I have 3 years worth now.

Let's move along. There's a men's group, women's group, prayer groups, bible study groups.... The list goes on. Find a place to plug yourself in.

Outside the church walls, we support local, regional and international mission efforts. If you heart isn't moved by watching a Rwandan ZOE kid go from rags and hunger to living and thriving as a part of the community, you need a heart transplant. Seriously.

Matthew 25:37-40. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? 39When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' "The King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

Your church needs you. It takes all of us working and learning together to grow, gain wisdom and become mature Christians. So, grab your fedora and let's go Elwood - we're taking the bluesmobile for a run. We're on a mission from God!

Amen? Amen.



We are approaching the Liturgical Season in the church year of Lent. Lent means the 40 days (excluding Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Easter. On Ash Wednesday you will see people with ashes in the form of a cross on their forehead. The ashes are typically from the palms of the previous year's Palm Sunday that were dried and burned. The ashes are a reminder of our

need for repentance. We are reminded of the 40 days Jesus spent in fasting in the desert and enduring temptation by Satan. Lent is a period of reflection. It comes from the old English word "lencten" which means lengthen. It is a time of reflection and a time to prepare for Easter. We pray to seek God's forgiveness, grace and mercy and turn away from our sins. The liturgical color is purple, usually the deepest shade. Music may reflect prayers of confession to God, cries of lament and expressions of trust. The Gloria is not sung during Lent.

The word, "Alleluia," is neither sung or spoken. Sometimes the music will represent the simple way of life.

May the music this Lent, help you to reflect and remember how much God loves you and is always ready to welcome you home. Soli Deo Gloria
